			time, I yelled, "her leg is stuck," but the driver, who
			was at the top of the stairs, and the plant employee,
			who was standing further up the ramp towards the
			truck door, did not appear to hear me. The driver
			then proceeded to hit the sow at least 5 times on the
			side of the face with the rattle paddle in an effort to
			get her to move. The truck driver hit her with enough
			force that she started vocalizing louder than she had
			been while still trying to get her leg unstuck. The
			sow finally was able to get her leg unstuck due to the
			jostling created when the other sows bumped into
			her. The sow then turned around and made it down
			the rest of the stairs and ramp. I did not notice a limp
			or other injury to the sow in question. When the 3

and proceeded to jot down what I had witnessed.
Assistant Plant Manager REDACTED approached
me to perform antemortem on a different pen of
