

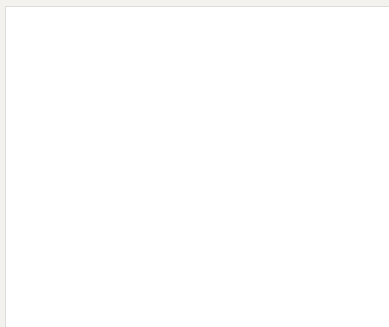

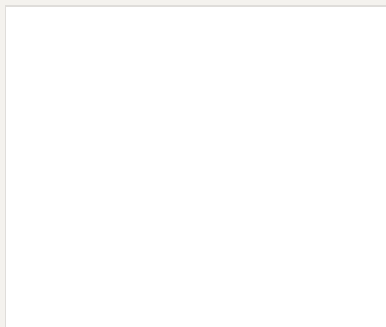

Can I drive a trailer or RV through the park? 


The roadways through the park are wide enough for a trailer or RV to navigate. However, if you choose you can unhook your trailer in the Trailer Parking section of the parking lot before you drive through.

Can I drive through with pets in the vehicle? 

All pets must be in the cab of the vehicle. If your pet cannot ride in the cab of the vehicle we do offer complimentary kennels during your visit. For the safety of the wildlife on exhibit, No Pets or Service Animals will be allowed in common areas behind the gift shop. Including but not limited to: Bear Cub Exhibit, Amusement Rides, Petting Zoo, or the Jurassic Creek Exhibit.

Can I drive through more than once? 


You may re-enter the drive through portion of the park unlimited times during your visit. The re-entry gate will close at the same time as the admission gate.

Do you accept credit and debit cards? 


We accept all major credit cards and debit cards. (VISA, MasterCard, AMEX, Discover)

Do you accept checks or travelers checks? 


We do accept Traveler's Checks. We do NOT accept personal checks.

Do you honor the National Parks Pass? 


We are not affiliated with the national park service; therefore, National Parks Pass and Golden Age Passes are not valid at Yellowstone Bear World.

How long should I plan on spending at Yellowstone Bear World? 


You should plan on spending at least 1 ½ to 2 hours for your visit. However, with the re-entry to the drive through and the other experiences (Curator Tours, Bottle Feeding, Amusement Rides) many visitors will spend 3-5 hours.

When is a good time to view the animals? 

We feed the animals throughout the day so any time is a good time to visit the park. If your schedule is flexible, the mornings are generally a little better than the afternoons when it is hot.

Where is Yellowstone Bear World located? 


We are located 5 miles south of Rexburg, ID right off of US HWY 20. [See Map](#)

How far is Yellowstone Bear World from West Yellowstone, MT? 

We are approximately 80 miles south of West Yellowstone, MT on US HWY 20.

How far is Yellowstone Bear World from Jackson, WY? 


We are approximately 80 miles west of Jackson, WY using State HWY 33.

Do you have an ATM machine? 

We do have an ATM machine located in the Three Bears Gift Shop.

Can I purchase items from the gift shop online? 

At this time we do not have an online store, but we are working on it. If you would like to purchase items you have seen during past visits we can arrange purchase via e-mail. What is the weather like at Yellowstone Bear World during the season? 

Average Temp Highs: May- 65 degrees, June 74 degrees, July 82 degrees, August 81 degrees, September 71 degrees, October 60 degrees

Is Yellowstone Bear World wheelchair accessible? 

Yes, the areas in and around the Three Bears Gift Shop are all wheelchair accessible. The exception would be the Curator Tour. On the Curator Tour the passengers are required to stand in an open air vehicle during tour.

Is Yellowstone Bear World ethical? 

At Yellowstone Bear World we want everyone to have the chance to experience wildlife up close and in person. Our park is designed to allow people to see them in their natural habitat. Bear cubs at Yellowstone Bear World will stay with their mothers for the first eight weeks of their lives in their dens, enabling them to receive their mother's precious, nutritious milk. We start early in order to establish a bond with the cubs at Yellowstone Bear World so that they will receive safe and proper care throughout their lives.

At Yellowstone Bear World we are the sole providers of support and food for the animals born here. We must have the ability to safely care for the animals at Yellowstone Bear World. Female bears are very protective of their cubs in the wild. Bear cubs in the wild will stay with their mothers for up to two years, and during this time the mother will not breed. The male bear sees the cubs as a threat to breeding and will try to eliminate the cubs.

Because of the drive through nature of Yellowstone Bear World, it is much safer and much more ethical for the animals, the visitors, and our staff to allow the cubs to be taken care of by our professional animal keepers.

Bear cub crusade: Protesters return to Baby Animal Days

Protesters with People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) and the Utah Animal Rights Coalition stood outside the American West West Heritage Center's Baby Animal Days on Saturday, displaying signs of disapproval and concern about bear cubs at the event provided

by Yellowstone Bear World.

This was the second year in a row that the event has drawn protesters.

Jordan Hennessy, who coordinated the demonstration, said she hoped the protest will get people to think twice about attending the event in the future.

"I hope that they will reconsider before purchasing tickets next year," Hennessy said.

One protestor, Amy Meyer, said her motivation was to educate people on the cruelty of what they were supporting.

"These bear cubs are taken away from their mothers when they're only a few weeks old, where in the wild, they'd be living with their mothers for two years. And, you know, I grew up in Wyoming right outside of Yellowstone National Park, and I grew up loving bears," Meyer said.

"People need to know and be exposed to what Yellowstone Bear World does to get these cubs here today, and how they're just treated as props and commodities."

According to Hennessy, taking cubs from their mothers at a young age is harmful for the animals.

"The premature separation from their mothers and the stress from constant human interaction can cause the bear cubs to suffer from psychological and physical trauma," Hennessy said.

"Yellowstone Bear World knows this and they still continue to breed cubs to line their pockets."

According to Dylan Rider, a protestor who said he had worked at a bear sanctuary in Montana, once bears are bred to look cute for photo operations and other attractions outgrow their purpose, their future is uncertain.

Rider explained the sanctuary he worked at rescued brown and grizzly bears because they cannot be rehabilitated after becoming accustomed to people. If they are released into the wild after growing comfortable with humans, Rider said they go to populated areas for food, and eventually are reported to animal control.

Though he understands the appeal of watching cubs and photographing the small animals, Rider said the process through which these events happen makes it unethical.

"When you kind of understand where these bears come from, and how this whole system works, and where these bears eventually end up, it really kind of puts into perspective," Rider said. "It's just not good."

In an email to The Herald Journal, Bear World stated cubs born in its facility remain with their mothers for eight weeks after birth, when in the wild they remain with their mothers for two years. Bear World indicated it provides a safer way for people to see bears than viewing them in the wild because female bears are very protective of their cubs.

Bear World also said the bears born at its facility will remain there for life, and that the animals in its care are considered family.

The Heritage Center declined an opportunity to comment.

Background Information:

On October 20th, 2016 Gregg Woody and Karen Woody dba “Woody’s Menagerie” (WOODY) and USDA APHIS entered into a Consent Decision and Order (decision) to settle WOODY’s previous violations of the Animal Welfare Act. This signed decision included a suspension of WOODY’s license beginning October 25, 2016 and lasting 90 days. This suspension would remain in effect until WOODY demonstrated full compliance with the AWA and Regulations. In order to have the suspension lifted, WOODY would have to request an inspection and receive an inspection report with no non-compliant items. Upon receipt of a fully compliant inspection, the inspection report is submitted to the Administrative Law Judge who would then issue an Order Lifting the Suspension. Evidence shows that despite the prohibition to engage in regulated activity without a license until a demonstration of full compliance, Animal Care has reason to believe WOODY has continued to conduct regulated activity during the suspension period as outlined below.

On February 1, 2016 WOODY indicated his intent to exhibit while under suspension by sending an exhibition itinerary via email to Animal Care through the ACEAST email server (www.aceast@aphis.usda.gov) and to Anne Marie Houser, Animal Care Inspector (HOUSER). Prior to WOODY's email, he had not requested an inspection of his facility to demonstrate compliance.

WOODY transported animals for exhibition to the San Angelo Texas Stock Show as documented in an inspection report and associated photographs dated February 8, 2017. On February 9, 2016 APHIS officials Dr. Cynthia Digesualdo, Veterinary Medical Officer (VMO) (DIGESUALDO), and Bryan Irwin, Compliance Specialist (IRWIN) attended the San Angelo Stock Show in San Angelo, TX. They observed WOODY set up three exhibits of animals. Based on their observations, two non-compliant items were documented: **2.10(c) Licensee Whose Licenses Have Been Suspended or Revoked** and **2.126(a) Access and Inspection of Records and Property: Submission of Itineraries**. Upon a request to conduct a full inspection by DIGESUALDO, WOODY refused. DIGESUALDO and IRWIN drafted memoranda with additional details surrounding the events of the February 8, 2017 inspection report.

On February 21, 2017, WOODY sent an email via the ACEAST email server and to HOUSER requesting an inspection in order to lift the suspension. HOUSER and WOODY scheduled an inspection of his facility for February 28, 2017. HOUSER was accompanied by Dr. Susan Kingston Supervisory Animal Care Specialist (SACS)(KINGSTON) for the scheduled inspection. During this inspection, non-compliances were documented by the inspectors including **2.75(b)(1) Records: Dealers and Exhibitors** and **3.1(c)(3) Housing Facilities, General**. WOODY additionally provided acquisition and disposition records that indicated he had also engaged in regulated activities by both transporting and acquiring two animals during the period of suspension (see further discussion below). Consequently, Woody was also cited for **2.10 (c) Licensees whose Licenses have been Suspended or Revoked**.

According to the inspectors present at the February 28, 2017 inspection, during the exit interview, WOODY "became increasingly upset, combative and verbally abusive towards us". The inspectors indicated that due to this display of behavior, they decided to discontinue the remainder of the exit interview. WOODY was cited for **2.4 (CRITICAL) Non-Interference with APHIS Officials** on an inspection report dated February 28, 2017. This report was supplemented by a detailed memorandum from HOUSER which contains additional information on WOODY's behavior throughout the inspection process that same day.

WOODY has requested an additional inspection to demonstrate compliance in order to have the suspension lifted. This is scheduled for March 27, 2017.

In addition to the documentation of conducting regulated activity without a license via inspection reports, Animal Care personnel also conducted trace backs/trace forwards on the two animals transferred to/from WOODY during the period of his suspension. Dr. Gwynn Hallberg, VMO (HALLBERG) collected documentation during a routine inspection conducted at the facility owned by Molly Schaefer (SCHAEFER), Certificate 92-B-0208

(8136). One document collected by HALLBERG, the APHIS form 7020, documented the exchange or transfer of one female 11 week old cougar cub to WOODY. The animal was transported to Illinois via United Airlines as documented on air waybill AB (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) WOODY's records indicate that no other party transported the animal from the airport to his facility in IL. HOUSER collected documentation during a routine inspection of Clayhill Exotics, 33-C-0117 (2577) (EXOTICS) owned by Max Guthrie (GUTHRIE) indicating that WOODY delivered a white wolf to the facility on February 27th, 2017. The documentation indicated the animal was then retrieved by WOODY on March 8, 2017 and left EXOTIC's property. HOUSER obtained a statement from GUTHRIE describing the transfer.

On March 22, 2017 Dr. Konstanze Plumlee, VMO (PLUMLEE) received information from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Confined Wildlife and Commercial Enforcement, Missouri Department of Conservation (Contact # (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)) that WOODY was transporting two bear cubs from Idaho to Missouri (MO). The receiver of the cub (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) is located in Dixon, MO and is licensed as Barnyard Buddies LLC, Certificate 43-C-0369 (332141). According to Todd Houf, WOODY made a request to the Missouri Department of Conservation for permits to bring the bear cubs into the state. Yellowstone Bear World (YELLOWSTONE), Certificate 82-C-0042 (7360) informed PLUMLEE that WOODY in fact purchased the cubs although the Certificate of Veterinary Inspections (CVI) lists him only as the transporter.

Brian Hood, ACI (HOOD) received APHIS form 7019 from Yellowstone Bear World (YBW) license number 82-C-0042 (7360) on March 23, 2017. The documents indicate 10 bear cubs were sold to WOODY on March 21, 2017. The seller, YBW, stated in their email conversation with HOOD that the transaction was conducted with WOODY and that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was present to assist with the transport. YBW recorded the sale and took copies of WOODY and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) drivers' licenses.

Animal Care is requesting an investigation into the activities of WOODY including, but not limited to, exhibiting while under suspension, transporting animals and trading or exchanging covered animals while under suspension, refusing inspection while actively conducting regulated activity under suspension, and interfering with and being abusive towards APHIS officials during the normal course of their duties. Animal Care is seeking possible termination of license 33-C-0218 and possible permanent revocation of WOODY.

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Recently, WOODY has been inquiring as to the status of his license to the Eastern Regional Animal Care Office. In response, Assistant Deputy Administrator, Dr. Gerald Rushin issued a formal letter to WOODY via certified mail.

WOODY's records were not complete and did not fully disclose at least one or more of the following required information:

1. The name and address of the person from whom the animals were purchased or otherwise acquired;
2. The USDA license or registration number of the person if he or she is licensed or registered under the AWA;
3. The vehicle license number and state, and the driver's license number and state of the person, if he or she is not licensed or registered under the AWA;
4. The name and address of the person from whom the animals were sold or given;
5. The date of purchase, acquisition, sale, or disposal of the animal(s);
6. The species of the animal(s); and
7. The number of animals in the shipment.

On 12/03/12, G. WOODY acknowledged in his affidavit (Exhibit 18) that Investigator Dawson informed him that USDA reviewed the records from Wild Animal Safari, Strafford, Missouri, and that a Wild Animal Safari representative provided a photocopy of APHIS Form 7020, dated 01/06/11, listing 1 male lion (King), 2 female tigers (Sabrina and Sierra), and one female brown bear (Annie) transferred to him. G. WOODY confirmed that their records did not include information on the acquisition of the brown bear (Annie) on their APHIS 7019s, and also the disposition of the brown bear was not listed on a APHIS Form 7020.

G. WOODY also stated that the bear was delivered for slaughter at Eichman's Processing Co., Seward, Illinois. He added that he sold the processed bear meat to a buyer, and he did not prepare any sales invoice. The buyer picked the meat up at the plant.

On 02/13/13, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) manager of Eickman's Processing Company, 3226 S. Pecatonica Road, Seward, Illinois was interviewed by Investigator (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to verify the information provided by G. WOODY and determine additional exotic and domestic animals consigned by G. WOODY for slaughter. In his affidavit (Exhibit 273), (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) confirmed that G. WOODY consigned bears, African lions, yak, deer, elk, bison, and swine at (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Processing Co. for slaughter over the last 10 years.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he provided to Investigator (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) the Eickman's Processing Co. spreadsheet and invoices showing the G. WOODY consignments. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) spreadsheet (Exhibit 274, page 2), shows an entry on 01/10/11, 1 black bear owned by G. WOODY. The dressed weight is listed as 90 pounds. The spreadsheet also shows that G. WOODY consigned 17 bears and 10 lions for slaughter in 2008, 15 bears and 7 lions for slaughter in 2009, 1 bear for slaughter in 2011, and 9 bears and 4 lions for slaughter in 2012. WOODY's records did not include any disposition records showing the transport of these bears and lions to Eickman's Processing Co. The invoices (Exhibits 275 thru 289) show either G. WOODY as consignor or the name of the buyer(s) of the bear/lion whole carcasses. Czimer's Game & Seafood, Inc., Homer Glen, Illinois, and Steve Hildon, dba The Fallow Farm, are listed as the buyers.

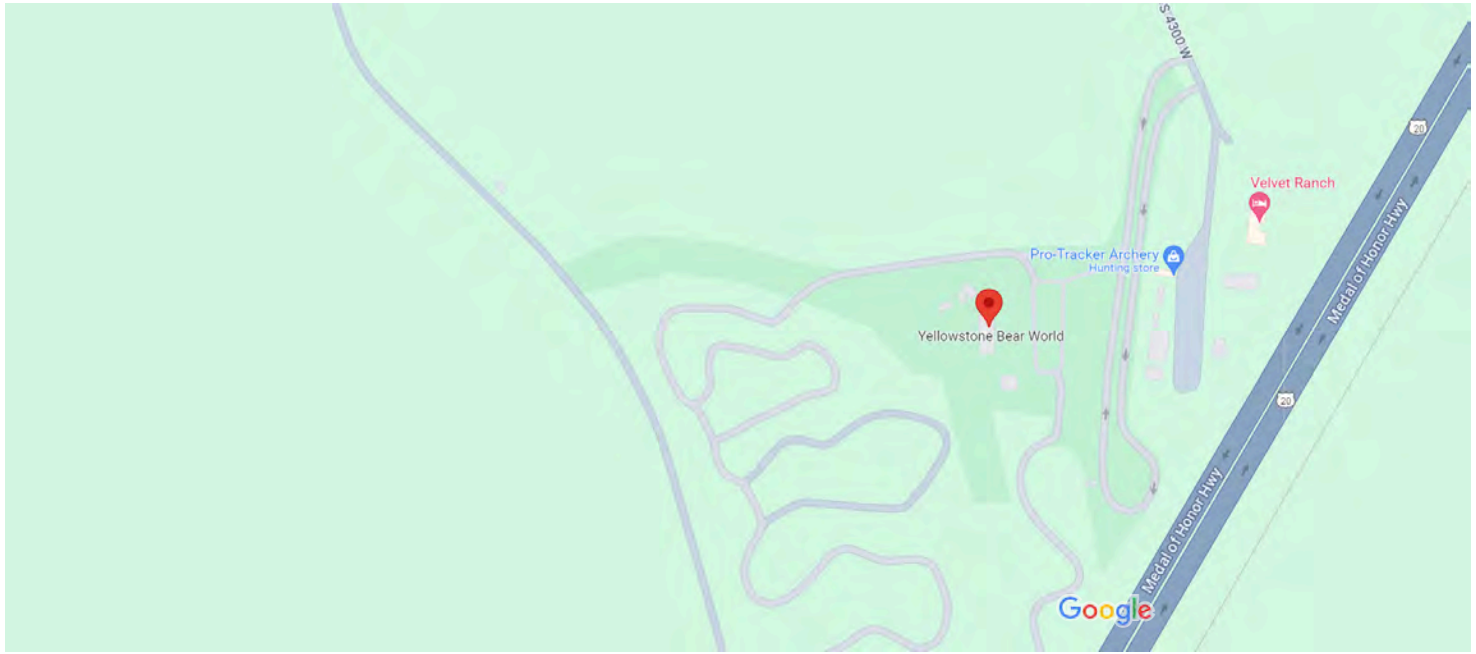

Animal activists put spotlight on Yellowstone Bear World

THORNTON — Alex Baldwin, of Idaho Falls, remembers when he first saw Yellowstone Bear World as a young boy.

He was amazed to see the large predators up close, closer than one could see the animals at any zoo or Yellowstone National Park.

It wasn't until he was an adult and returned that it occurred to him something may be wrong with the animal park. He noticed animals pacing in irritation, a few limping. The bears seemed aggravated, unable to climb the surrounding trees because the trees' bases had been wrapped in metal. (Such behaviors have been described by [researchers](#) as "zoochosis," a "mental illness in animals" caused by "confinement stress.")

And the feeding of bear cubs by the public, Bear World's star attraction, seemed, to Baldwin, less like a cool chance to interact with animals and more like an exploitative profit-driven practice that was harmful to the bears.

"It was 100 percent different from how I had imagined it as a child," Baldwin said.

The scene didn't sit right with him. He wanted to do something about it. Since then he has joined several other animal rights activists in criticizing how the business is run.

Bear World is not a sanctuary or a zoo. It's a for-profit animal exhibit.

According to Baldwin, other animal rights groups and several former Bear World employees, who spoke to the Post Register on the condition of anonymity, Bear World presents itself as a wildlife shelter that provides a safe place for bears to live, but in reality prioritizes profits at the cost of the physical and mental well-being of the animals.

Though Bear World operates by showing animals to the public, it does not have accreditation from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums, instead operating under a certification of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which has lower standards for animal care. The facility also has a USDA Class C (exhibitor) license, which allows it to breed animals, exhibit, buy and sell them.

During a September trip through the drive-thru facility with Baldwin, he pointed out several factors that concerned him.

Algae filled the ponds, which former employees have said are the main source of water for the animals.

Baldwin pointed out an elk that was limping, bears that were pacing, and birds that were eating the bears' food.

There was no barrier between the animals and the public touring the facility, except for the tourists' car doors. Customers are told to keep their vehicles moving at all times, but in some instances that was impossible as animals walked into the middle of the pathway.

Efforts to reach Yellowstone Bear World officials by phone and through social media for comment were unsuccessful.

Premature separation of bear cubs

In the wild, bear cubs typically stay with their mothers for the first two years of their lives. It's when the cubs to learn how to survive on their own.

According to one former employee, however, cubs born at Bear World are taken from their mothers at just one or two months old. They said animal keepers care for the animals in a shared house on the park's property, taking turns bottle-feeding them around the clock.

The idea, according to the animal keeper, was to acclimate the cubs early to being handled by humans. Two former employees said that once the cubs were separated from their mothers, they were never reintroduced to the sows.

Each year, as early as March, Bear World cubs are taken to interviews with local media, to a sporting goods store in Ammon and to an interactive museum in Utah for customers to interact with.

The publicity and public interactions help Bear World maintain its place as one of the area's top tourists draws.

Bear World claimed in a Facebook comment in 2017 that separating the bears from their mothers was necessary for the cubs, the staff and the mothers.

"The cubs are with their mothers until they are two months old, then they are cared for by our keeper staff," the comment said. "We do this for the safety of the cubs, safety of our staff, as well as the safety and overall quality of life of their mother."

Naturalist and National Geographic television host Casey Anderson, wrote in his 2010 book, "[The Story of Brutus: My Life With Brutus the Bear and the Grizzlies of North America](#)," that in early spring, male bears will sometimes kill cubs to mate with the female. Anderson is a former Yellowstone Bear World employee and Brutus is the grizzly bear he adopted from the facility, which he described as overcrowded, to save him from being euthanized.

Jay Pratte, director of animal care, conservation and education at New York's Utica Zoo and president of Bear Care Group, which trains zoos internationally on how to care for and manage bears, said premature separation of cubs from their mothers is one of the most harmful and exploitative practices of roadside animal exhibits.

"Kids can only learn certain things at certain times as they age," Pratte said. "With bears it's no different."

Pratte said the separation causes permanent distress to both the cub and their mothers, affecting their behavior for the rest of their lives. He said that at accredited zoos, cubs may be separated for medical emergencies, but that the goal is to return them to their mothers as soon as possible.

When bears are raised by humans, separate from their mothers, Pratte said the experience puts the bears "at war in their own head."

"Hand raising an animal doesn't make it domesticated," Pratte said.

Lisa Wathne, manager of captive wildlife protection for the Humane Society of the United States, said the organization opposes premature separation, as well as the public feeding of wild animals.

"The public contact with these baby animals is concerning and something we would like to see stop," Wathne said.

During the Post Register's trip through Bear World, animal handlers brought the cubs out to be bottle-fed by the public. For an extra \$55, anyone age 5 or older can feed a bear cub and pet it.

"What you're about to see is 100 percent illegal" Baldwin said as the cubs were brought

out.

Baldwin cited the [Animal Welfare Inspection Guide](#) produced by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in making his claim. The guide was last revised in January, and sets guidelines for personnel examining USDA licensed facilities.

"At approximately 12 – 16 weeks of age dangerous animals, such as, tigers, lions, bears, and wolves ... become too big, too fast and too strong to be used for public contact," the guide states. "If you encounter a licensee allowing public contact with a dangerous animal over 12 weeks of age, contact your (supervisory animal care specialist)."

Several former Bear World employees all said the bears are born after hibernation, typically in March at the latest. That would mean the bears fed by the public in September were at least six months older, above the 12-16 week maximum set in the inspection guide.

Pratte estimated the cubs were 8 months old based on photos taken by the Post Register of the cub feeding.

One former employee who was in charge of managing and caring for the bears when they worked at Bear World said the animals were old enough and strong enough to cause serious injury with their teeth or claws.

While there have been documented incidents of Bear World bears injuring park employees, the park is not required to file reports on such instances that happen on their property. Over the years the facility has received several citations for violations including underfeeding animals, failing to provide adequate veterinary care including proper vaccinations, and failing to maintain a primary enclosure in good repair, according to a [factsheet](#) compiled by People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals. In 2016, a wolf escaped from the facility by digging under a perimeter fence gate and was euthanized after it was located about 2 miles away from the park.

Employees at risk

All three former employees, who spoke to the Post Register on the condition of anonymity, said they lived in housing set up at or near Bear World. They said both interns and full-time employees worked 12 hours a day, six days a week. They were not paid hourly, with interns only receiving a stipend of \$500 every two weeks.

Most employees workers are in their 20s, according to two of the former employees, and start work there believing it's a way to help animals.

One former animal keeper said that at night they were expected to get grizzly bears into cages so they would not attempt to dig out of the facility. They said they were not trained on how to do so, and that it was especially challenging when the animal manager was on vacation.

In his book, Anderson told the story of one of the park's grizzlies escaping by digging its way out from under the facilities fence and making it to the highway. Anderson and a female co-worker used a trail of marshmallows, Hansel and Gretel style, to lure the sow back into the park and toward her enclosure. Once inside the park's gates, the bear attacked the woman with "a barrage of brutal strikes and bites" leaving the woman's arm looking like "hamburger meat."

Anderson said he drove to woman out of the park to one of the park owners so that she could be taken to the hospital and returned with three tranquilizer darts to subdue the bear.

"... (The sow) was the only breeding female grizzly bear they had," Anderson wrote. "Grizzly bear cubs were a vital asset in order to attract visitors to the park, so despite her disposition and rap sheet, they decided to let her stay."

Gregg Losinski, a bear expert who was the regional conservation educator for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, said the department was never told of the incident of the bear escaping, and that he only learned about it from Anderson's book.

"We were not kept in the loop regarding their bears," Losinski said. "Clearly there were things happening there that we were not aware of."

Pratte, who has worked with bears for decades, said he always keeps a barrier between himself and the animals he works with, and trains other zoos to do the same. In contrast, the former Bear World workers said they would go into the facility with the bears, equipped with a can of bear spray and a stick, with no training on how to use either.

"Sending in 20-somethings with a stick and a can of bear spray is utterly insane," Pratte said when told of the reported practice at Bear World.

One former employee said an older male bear once attacked a younger female bear with the employee standing next to them.

"You can tell when one of them is in a bad mood," the employee said. "They have a certain stomp to them."

Fights between bears were reportedly common, and the former employees described three incidents in which older bears killed younger ones.

Pratte said it's important for bears to be able to get away from each other when sharing an enclosure. In the recent tour of Bear World, however, the animals were seen in close proximity to each other, with around 70 bears sharing 125 acres.

"Black bears are not meant to be smashed together into that small a space," one of the former employees said.

Two former employees both described incidents in which workers misused the bear spray, hitting either themselves or another worker with the spray.

All three former employees said they were embarrassed or ashamed to have worked for Bear World after looking back at how it managed the animals.

One employee, however, said they stayed for years because they were concerned for what would happen to the bears if they left. They said they were still afraid of what would happen to the animals if Bear World were to come under USDA investigation.

"That's why a lot of people don't talk," they said. "It's not a happy place, but they know how to show you a good time."

The company you keep

The trade and exhibition of wild animals has come under increased scrutiny in recent years thanks to documentaries such as "Blackfish" and "Tiger King."

Despite its repeated claims that all its bear cubs stay at Yellowstone Bear World, records show it has sent bear cubs to various facilities with controversial histories, including one featured in the Netflix documentary series "Tiger King."

Wathne noted that only some of the cubs stay at Bear World for public feeding and to be introduced into the park. In a 2017 Facebook comment, Yellowstone Bear World claimed all cubs stay at the facility.

"The cubs here were born in, and will remain in, our park for the duration of their lives," the comment stated.

Transfer records with various states, however, show at least 96 bears have been sold to other facilities since 2009. Selling the bears is a way to keep the park's bear population in check.

In an interview with the [Grizzly Times Podcast](#), Anderson said "People who come to wildlife parks want to see little baby bears or big adult bears, but they don't want to see awkward teenage bears."

At the time Anderson adopted Brutus he said that because the park had reached saturation in its bear population "they had a policy, which is legal to this day with captive animals, that they would euthanize the cubs at the end of the year to keep the population the same."

Anderson said it was at that point he knew he "didn't want to be part of that world anymore."

Inspired by Brutus, he founded [Montana Grizzly Encounter](#), a grizzly bear rescue and education sanctuary, near Bozeman in 2004. Brutus [died](#) there earlier this year at the age of 19.

One of the former employees who interned at Bear World said employees were only told the bears were sent to partnered facilities, and that employees often wondered what became of the animals they helped raise.

Bear World President Courtney Ferguson told the [Deseret News](#) the facility only trades animals with USDA-certified institutions and the primary purpose is to keep genetics diverse and prevent inbreeding. "It's standard practice in the industry," he said. "I see nothing wrong with it."

Among those facilities that received bears from Bear World were Greater Wynnewood Animal Park, formerly owned by Joseph Maldonado-Passage, more commonly known as "Joe Exotic," which received four black bear cubs in April 2013. He was convicted in 2019 on 17 counts of animal abuse and two counts of attempted murder. Another was Bear Country USA in South Dakota, which received two black bear cubs aged at two-and-a-half months. In 2006, two members of the family that owns Bear Country were convicted in federal court for illegally selling bear gallbladders to a business that sold "[specialty gourmet products](#)."

The vast majority of bears, 84 in total were transported to Woody's Menagerie, in Mulberry Grove, Illinois, owned by Gregg Woody. According to Wathne, Woody was investigated by the USDA in 2016 for poor veterinary care for animals, providing inadequate space for bears and big cats, and failure to provide proper shelter for the animals during the winter. The [Humane Society of the United States claims](#) Woody "has collected lions and bears and then sent these animals to slaughter."

Idaho Department of Agriculture records show Bear World shipped more than 30 bears to Woody between 2017 and 2021.

Wathne criticized Yellowstone Bear World's choice of business partners, saying it showed the company saw the animals primarily as products.

"If they truly cared about bears, they would not be producing them to send to other facilities," Wathne said.



What is a Sanctuary

Around the world, there are many entities that describe themselves as a “sanctuary” or “rescue” for displaced, wild, equine and farm animals. However, the quality of animal care and sustainability of the organization varies widely among them.

It is a poorly regulated industry, in which facilities that keep animals in deplorable conditions can identify themselves as compared to those of the highest quality. For anyone invested in the welfare of captive animals, there is a need to differentiate the best sanctuaries and rescues to determine where funds would be best invested, where the need for help is greatest, who provides a model to follow and who can be turned to in times of crisis.

GFAS' definition of “sanctuary” is any facility providing temporary or permanent safe haven to animals in need while meeting the principles of **true sanctuaries**: providing excellent and humane care for their animals in a non-exploitative environment and having ethical policies in place, regarding:

- tours,
- commercial trade,
- exhibition,
- acquisition and disposition,
- breeding and more

All sanctuaries accredited by GFAS are true sanctuaries, meeting these basic principles and meeting our Standards of Excellence.

Yellowstone Bear World offers up-close wildlife encounters—and the chance to bottle-feed bear cubs

Courtney Ferguson views Yellowstone Bear World as his family serving families. After all, his family has owned and operated the wildlife attraction since it opened in 1998.

“We’re a drive-through wildlife park offering families encounters with majestic animals that can sometimes be hard to spot in Yellowstone, including bears, wolves, elk, moose, and bison,” Ferguson says, of the 120-acre wildlife park. “Folks can also bottle-feed bear cubs for a memory that will last a lifetime!”

In addition to self-guided drive-through tours, Yellowstone Bear World offers guided tours in an open-air vehicle that offer birds-eye views of North American wildlife, a petting zoo, and an amusement park that includes train rides and a rollercoaster. And with all-day access, families can drive through time and again.

“On the guided tours, we talk about the personalities and traits of each animal in the park, and, of course, the fascinating hibernation cycles of the bears,” Ferguson says. “It’s also a great photo opportunity because the animals come right up to our guided-tour vehicle where visitors can feed them.”

“We opened the park because of my father’s experiences as a child,” Ferguson says. “His family would take trips to Yellowstone, and be fascinated by all the animals and the ‘bear jams’ that would clog the road for hours. We wanted to recreate that childhood experience here.”

Yellowstone Bear World is located near Rexburg, Idaho, along the southwestern edge of the Yellowstone National Park. Yellowstone Bear World is open seven days a week from Memorial Day Weekend through mid-October. Weekend-only access begins April 16.
