Dear Dr. Sui,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 15, 2024 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (Virginia Tech) following up on an initial January 31, 2024 notification by telephone.

According to the information provided, this office understands that the Virginia Tech Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to failure of research personnel to complete required training, unauthorized personnel performing animal activities, and failure to meet occupational health requirements. The final report states field work involving bats was performed outside the United States in June and July 2023. A records review revealed the following findings:

- · An individual assisting with field work had not completed required training.
- · Some personnel assisting with field work were not identified in the approved protocol.
- Specific Occupational Health and Safety reporting expectations were not met.

The report states the Principal Investigator (PI) submitted an adverse event regarding the unexpected deaths of 15 bats over the course of the field work. It is further stated the cause of death could not be determined. In response to the incident, the PI received an education letter from the IACUC with the following corrective action plan:

- · Submit a personnel change amendment to bring the protocol into compliance.
- · Submit applicable amendments and gain approval prior to initiating new work.
- · Ensure all personnel are fully trained prior to the next field work.
- · Ensure adverse events are submitted in a timely manner.

It is noted the field work is supported by NSF funding (Award #: 2116748), OLAW surmises the OH&S expectations have been met as well. Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy.

Virginia Tech received an email from Dr. Jacquelyn Tubbs on March 14, 2024, outlining several questions for clarification based on her review of the final report dated March 1, 2024, submitted by Virginia Tech ("IO-OLAW A-3208-1R Final Report").

This letter is written in response to Dr. Tubbs' questions and is intended to supplement the IO-OLAW A-3208-1R Final Report.

## Question: Description of the incident (i.e., when the incident occurred, individuals involved, nature of the animal welfare concern, etc.)

The incident occurred in June-July 2023.

Bat field work was conducted outside of the United States in June and July 2023. Subsequently, concerns about the field work were reported to the animal care and use program.

Based on review of records, it was found that all personnel assisting with the field work had fully completed the required training with the exception of one person; some personnel assisting with the field work were not identified in the approved protocol; and certain Occupational Health and Safety reporting expectations were not met.

The PI also submitted an adverse event report of the unexpected deaths of 15 bats over the course of the field work. It was reported that the cause of death could not be determined.

#### Question: Specific corrective actions

After discussion of the concerns and review at their December 2023 meeting, the IACUC sent an educational reminder letter to the PI containing the following corrective action plan: (1) submit a personnel change amendment to bring the protocol back into compliance, (2) submit applicable amendments and gain approval prior to initiating new work, (3) ensure all personnel are fully trained prior to the next field work, and (4) ensure adverse events are submitted timely. The required personnel change amendment was completed.

A third report states "A thorough review of vivarium husbandry procedures and methods of communication with research personnel was undertaken following receipt of reported event." However, none of these reports include a description of the incident (i.e., when the incident occurred, individuals involved, nature of the animal welfare concern, etc.) or the specific corrective actions taken to address the matter. The fourth final report also lacks a description of the incident that occurred and detailed corrective action plan in response.

Virginia Tech, in accordance with Assurance A-3208-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of animal-related activities that were determined to be potentially non-compliant with the associated IACUC-approved protocol. This animal research study involves bats.

This incident was first reported to Teagan Ware, Animal Welfare Program Analyst, OLAW, on January 31, 2024 via a telephone call led by

A thorough review of a field work expedition under the protocol was undertaken following receipt of reported concerns. During the review process, the PI submitted an adverse event report. The results of the review were provided to the IACUC in December 2023. The IACUC reviewed and discussed the facts, circumstances, and potential non-compliances with the approved protocol including with respect to personnel training and animal welfare.

After discussion, the IACUC sent an educational reminder letter to the PI due to incongruencies relating to procedures and personnel with the approved protocol. To address the situation, corrective actions were taken including the submission of a personnel change amendment to bring the protocol back into compliance, and the amendment was approved by the IACUC.

The funding source of these animals is via the NSF (Federal Award #: 2116748). Per PHS requirement, the PI has been informed that they must cooperate with their grant administrator to determine if any funding related actions must be taken.
