On Friday, May 17, 2024, FWC was notified by the Department of Health, of a Monkey Bite(IBE 24-023) that occurred on May 12, 2024 at Zoological Wildlife Foundation (ZWF), located at 16225 SW 172 ave, Miami, FL. ZWF is a licensed wildlife facility. I then contacted Mario Tabraue (licensee/ co-owner of ZWF) and inquired further. He stated he was not at the facility when the incident happened and was not aware of any bite incident, he would find out and get back to me.

On Monday, May 20, 2024, Maria Tabraue (secondary licensee/owner of facility) emailed me an in house incident report generated by the facility. Upon reviewing the incident report, it states that while conducting a Capuchin Monkey interaction encounter, the Capuchin Monkey named Romeo, bit a guest taking part in the encounter. The guest/victim was identified as **form formation**. Employee statements provided by the facility state that neither Mario or Maria Tabraue were notified of the incident as it was a minor bite which was treated with first aid at the facility. The manager over the tour guides, which was not present, was also not made aware of the incident by the handler. They also stated they were unaware that the victim went to the hospital to have the injury checked. This information is received in good faith and unable to be confirmed due to lack of cooperation from victim and handler involved.

Upon reviewing the hospital report, it appears the victim was administered a tetanus shot, which from my experience, is standard medical protocol with any type of animal bite. The medical report described the bite as a "small superficial bite wound to the distal volar aspect of right thumb." This description is stated on the attached medical report, on the third page, on the line which states "skin."

Mario stated, the handler involved in this case was fired immediately upon learning of the incident and provided contact information for her. She was identified as **a statement and was unable to reach her and my** calls/messages were never returned. I also drove to the address listed on her license but was unsuccessful in locating her.

I also made contact with the victim in this case, identified as **sector (minor-17 years old)**. We spoke on the phone and she stated while she was taking part in an encounter with the monkey, her brother was next to her and the monkey jumped on to her brother as part of the encounter. She then attempted to feed it a snack when the monkey reacted and bit her thumb. I attempted to schedule a time and date to take a written statement from the victim but due to schedule conflicts with the victim, was unsuccessful. I also advised her I

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could email her a blank written statement to fill out and a return to me but never heard back from her at that point. Based on the facts I have, the extent of injury, as the medical report states, was a superficial injury and treatment was provided at the hospital which makes it a reportable bite incident. Florida administrative code (FAC) 68A-6.018 states the rules regarding injury and escape incidents involving captive wildlife, which are copied below:

### 68A-6.018 Injuries and Escapes.

(1) Any person in possession of captive wildlife which requires a license or permit issued under Sections 379.3761, 379.3762, or 379.372, F.S., or those facilities exempt from licensure pursuant to Section 379.3761(4), F.S., shall report any injury from such wildlife which results in:

(a) **Treatment beyond basic first aid**, except if occurring to the licensee, an employee authorized as a Corporate Authorized Individual on the license in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(e) or 68A-6.017(2)(e)4., F.A.C, or an individual with required experience documentation on file for such wildlife in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(c), 68A-6.004(2)(d), 68A-6.004(4)(b), or 68A-6.017(2)(e), F.A.C. Such injury shall be reported immediately, or as soon as practicable, to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Division of Law Enforcement.

Although this encounter being offered by ZWF is legally allowed for Class 3 wildlife, this is the second bite incident reported to FWC, involving this specific Capuchin monkey named Romeo. The first incident (IBE 24-002) occurred on January 22nd, 2024. Per FAC 68A-6.016, a commission officer (FWC) has the authority to remove any animal from public contact when any condition exists, which results in a threat to human safety. I, as a commission officer, have determined that the temperament this monkey has displayed, is an issue which causes a threat to human safety and as a result I am advising this facility (ZWF) and its owners (Mario and Maria Tabraue), that this Capuchin monkey (Romeo) shall not be used for any public contact encounters to prevent injuries to members of the public. It is also the responsibility of the facility to ensure that wildlife used for contact with the public shall have been evaluated by the exhibitor to ensure compatibility with the uses intended. This notification was sent via email to Mario and Maria Tabraue on June 3rd, 2024, to which they both acknowledged receipt. I have copied the public contact rules below.

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68A-6.016 Public Contact with Captive Wildlife.

**Unconfined captive wildlife shall be maintained under rigid supervision and control, so as to prevent injuries to members of the public.** No captive wildlife shall be tethered outdoors unsupervised. To provide for public safety, all wildlife shall be tethered or controlled in such a manner as to prevent physical contact with the public and a structural safety barrier, as provided in paragraph 68A-6.009(2)(b), F.A.C., must be present to prevent physical contact with unconfined Class I or Class II wildlife except in instances where public contact is allowed in subsection (1), below.

(1) Public contact and exhibition.

(a) General: All Class I, II or III wildlife that will be used for contact with the public shall have been evaluated by the exhibitor to ensure compatibility with the uses intended. All wildlife shall be exhibited in a manner that prevents injuries to the public and the wildlife. The exhibitor shall take reasonable sanitary precautions to minimize the possibility of disease or parasite transmission which could adversely affect the health or welfare of citizens or wildlife. When any conditions exists that results in a threat to human safety, or the welfare of the wildlife, the animal(s) shall, at the direction of a Commission officer, be immediately removed from public contact for an interval necessary to correct the unsafe or deficient condition.

Upon completion of my investigation, I have noted the following violations to which written warning was issued to both Mario and Maria Tabraue as co-owners/co-licensees of this facility.

VIOLATION WARNINGS ISSUED (Warning numbers: W1239378, W1239377):

<u>68A-6.016(1)(a):</u> Public contact and Exhibition: General: All Class 1, 2, and 3 wildlife that will be used for contact with the public shall have been evaluated by the exhibitor to ensure compatibility with the uses intended.

On Monday, January 22, 2024 I received a report via email from the Department of Health in reference to a monkey bite that occurred at Zoological Wildlife Foundation(ZWF) on January 20, 2024. I had not received any previous report of this incident. I then contacted Mario Tabraue (licensee/owner of ZWF) and inquired further. He stated he was not at the facility when the incident happened, but that previous Saturday, January 20th, an employee of the facility, Melissa Zamora, was conducting a private encounter with 1 capuchin monkey when the bite occurred. Tabraue provided me with the facility's internal report of the incident as well (attached). Per the ZWF report, there were 3 total juveniles bit by the capuchin, and records provided by the department of health show that one was treated at Nicklaus Childrens Hospital. The three juveniles (name provided by dept of health), (last name unknown) and (last name unknown). were 1) was the juvenile taken to the hospital. I then contacted the hospital to inquire about the extent of injury for The hospital stated that suffered a minor puncture wound which was disinfected, he was then given a tetanus shot and prescribed antibiotics. No further treatment or care was given. In reference to and , pictures were provided by the facility in their internal report and both injuries appeared to be treated with basic first aid and no record of treatment beyond first aid was provided. The Department of Health did not have any record of any other children treated at the hospital. According to all the reports provided, all victims were tourists from Brazil and have since left the United States. I was unable to contact the out of country phone number for the parents provided to the Department of health. I did, however, locate an email address provided, and I attempted to email to speak to the victims/parents of the victims but never received any response. As a result, I was unable to confirm further details of the injury or incident from the victims.

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On Tuesday, January 23, 2024, at 1400 hours, I arrived at ZWF and met with employee/animal handler, Melissa Zamora, to obtain a sworn written statement from her about the incident. Zamora did state that the monkey was tethered the whole time with a harness and in her control with the leash. She provided a written statement as follows:

"During a hands-on private encounter with the capuchin because I saw it was a large family with plenty of kids I decided to place the capuchin on our display table and I had the children line up on one side of the table with treats for the capuchin to come grab and then sit next to them so that they could get their photos. The rules I gave the kids were as follows: do not restrain him in any way, no holding him down or picking him up, make sure your hand is open and flat so he can see the treats, and do not reach out to him in any way just wait for him to come to and I will let you know when it is okay to pet him on the back." As the encounter went on I had to repeat there rules constantly because the kids were not following instructions always. Ultimately, one of the kids saw the capuchin sitting closer o me and not giving them too much attention so he laid both hands on Romeo(capuchin) causing him to turn and bite because he is not usually comfortable with this sort of restraint. Afterward while tending to his bit the two other children came around the other side and approached the capuchin in a similar manner resulting in him briefly biting them as well. I attempted asking the parents to help ensure that all three children were standing back and following instructions but that help was not thoroughly provided. Afterwards, I immediately placed the capuchin back in its designated enclosure and took the children to tend to their minor wounds. I had them all wash their hands, disinfected with alcohol prep wipes, applied antibiotic ointment, and placed a bandage on all three children."

On Wednesday, January 31st, 2024, I had not received any response from the victim or their families and upon investigation of the this incident I noted the below violations. On January 11, 2023 new reporting requirements for captive wildlife injuring became effective, one of the requirements being, any person in possession of captive wildlife shall report any injury which results in treatment beyond first aid. In this case two of the juveniles were treated on site with first aid, but one of the juveniles did get extra treatment from the hospital. I emailed the below rules to Mario and Maria Tabraue, since they are the licensees and responsible parties for the facility to educate them on all the new reporting requirements. I also copied the captive wildlife public contact rules below for reference. The violations below were noted and issued to each individual as a written warning. Mario stated, that as a result of this incident, they will restrict tours of this nature to persons 18 years and older, and the facility is also using a different type of restraint system to offer extra control of tethered captive wildlife. No further on this case.

#### VIOLATIONS NOTED:

<u> Mario / Maria Tabraue :</u>

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#### 1) 68A-6.018 Injuries and Escapes.

(1) Any person in possession of captive wildlife which requires a license or permit issued under Sections 379.3761, 379.3762, or 379.372, F.S., or those facilities exempt from licensure pursuant to Section 379.3761(4), F.S., shall report any injury from such wildlife which results in:

#### 2) 68A-6.018 Injuries and Escapes.

When any conditions exists that results in a threat to human safety, or the welfare of the wildlife, the animal(s) shall, at the direction of a Commission officer, be immediately removed from public contact for an interval necessary to correct the unsafe or deficient condition.

#### 68A-6.018 Injuries and Escapes.

(1) Any person in possession of captive wildlife which requires a license or permit issued under Sections 379.3761, 379.3762, or 379.372, F.S., or those facilities exempt from licensure pursuant to Section 379.3761(4), F.S., shall report any injury from such wildlife which results in:

(a) Treatment beyond basic first aid, <u>except</u> if occurring to the licensee, an employee authorized as a Corporate Authorized Individual on the license in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(e) or 68A-6.017(2)(e)4., F.A.C, or an individual with required experience documentation on file for such wildlife in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(c), 68A-6.004(2)(d), 68A-6.004(4)(b), or 68A-6.017(2)(e), F.A.C. Such injury shall be reported immediately, or as soon as practicable, to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Division of Law Enforcement.

(b) Serious bodily injury to the licensee, an employee authorized as a Corporate Authorized Individual on the license in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(e) or 68A-6.017(2)(e)4., F.A.C, or an individual with required experience documentation on file for such wildlife in accordance with Rule 68A-6.004(2)(c), 68A-6.004(2)(d), 68A-6.004(4)(b), or 68A-6.017(2)(e), F.A.C. Such injury shall be reported immediately, or as soon as practicable, to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Division of Law Enforcement.

#### (2) Escapes

Any person in possession of wildlife which requires a license or permit issued under Sections 379.3761, 379.3762, or 379.372, F.S., or those facilities exempt from licensure pursuant to Section 379.3761(4), F.S., shall make reasonable efforts to ensure recapture and return of the escaped wildlife to containment. Such person shall contact the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Division of Law Enforcement as required below:

(a) Any person in possession of Class I wildlife, Class II wildlife, or capuchin, spider, or woolly monkeys, shall report any escapes of such wildlife immediately upon discovery. For the purposes of this paragraph, "escape" shall mean escape from the primary enclosure or escape from transport enclosure, leash, other constraint, or rigid supervision and control while outside of the primary enclosure.

(b) Any person in possession of venomous reptiles or reptiles of concern shall report any escapes of such wildlife immediately upon discovery. For the purposes of this paragraph, "escape" shall mean escape from primary containment when its whereabouts are unknown, or any escape from secondary containment.

(c) Any person in possession of Class III wildlife, except capuchin, spider, or woolly monkeys, shall report any escapes of such wildlife as soon as practicable, but no later than 12 hours after discovery of the escape. For the purposes of this paragraph, "escape" shall include any of the following:

1. Escape from the primary enclosure when the whereabouts of the wildlife is unknown;

2. Escape from the primary enclosure when the whereabouts of the wildlife is known, but wildlife cannot be captured prior to the end of the required reporting period;

3. Escape from the approved facility location;

4. Escape from transport enclosure, leash, other constraint, or rigid supervision and control while outside the approved facility location.

(3) Any person authorized to possess Class I wildlife or venomous reptiles shall maintain a list of the current contiguous landowners or neighbors included with the information required in subsections 68A-6.004(7) and 68A-6.017(4), F.A.C. Such list shall include the name and address for contiguous landowners or neighbors. For the purposes of this paragraph, a "contiguous landowner or neighbor" shall mean the current resident, if known, or landowner for all properties sharing a common boundary with the facility location. If the contiguous landowner or neighbor is a business complex or multi-unit dwelling, or if the facility is located in a business complex or multi-unit dwelling, the name and address of the building manager or property manager shall be maintained, if one exists. The entire width of a roadway shall be considered sharing a common boundary in instances of a roadway between neighboring properties.

(4) Failure to report any injury as specified in subsection (1) above, shall be considered a violation of this rule.

(5) Failure to report any escapes of wildlife as specified in subsection (2) above, shall be considered a violation of this rule.

(6) Any person who maintains captive wildlife in a manner which results in injury as specified in subsection (1) above due to such person maintaining captive wildlife in an unsafe condition or in a manner which results in threats to public safety commits a violation of paragraph 68A-6.009(1)(e), F.A.C.

(7) Any person who maintains captive wildlife in a manner which results in escape of wildlife as specified in subsection (2) above due to such person maintaining captive wildlife in an unsafe condition or in a manner which results in a threat to public safety commits a violation of paragraph 68A-6.009(1)(f), F.A.C.

On Monday, February 27, 2023, at approximately 1630 hours, FWC Investigator Stiffler notified me he received report, that Mario Tabraue, the owner/licensee of Zoological Wildlife Foundation (ZWF -16225 SW 172nd Ave, Miami, FL), was bit by his Gila Monster and was being taken to the hospital. For reference, ZWF is a licensed wildlife facility, to include authorization for venomous reptiles (VR).While Investigator Stiffler gathered more information for me, I made contact with Miami Dade Fire Resue (MDFR) Venom 1, to confirm they were aware of the envenomation incident. MDFR Captain Shaw advised me, he was en route to West Kendall Baptist Hospital, where Mario was taken by his girlfriend Vanessa. Captain Shaw advised that there is no anti-venom for Gila Monsters, and these envenomations are treated by the symptoms the patient is showing. I then spoke with Vanessa, who advised that Mario was in the Emergency Room (ER) already under care of the ER doctor, but he was in severe pain and had gone into anaphylactic shock. Captain Shaw later provided the The Venom 1 alarm number (alarm # 3049421).

On Tuesday, February 28, 2023, I was able to speak with Mario Tabraue directly, to follow up on his condition. He advised, he was still in the hospital, but slowly improving and recovering from the bite. I then asked him to provide details of how the bite occurred. He stated, the bite occurred while he was treating a protruding hemipenis on the Gila monster. The protruding hemipenis, was a result of the Gila Monster being in distress and mishandled when it was stolen from the facility the week before, and dropped off in a pillow sack days after, at the gate of the facility. While treating the condition, the Gila Monster was able to bite Mario on his right ring finger for approximately 20 seconds, before it let go. Within approximately 20 minutes, he began to feels the effect of the envenomation and went into anaphylactic shock shortly after. At that point he was taken to the hospital for treatment. The bite occurred with in the approved secondary containment area of his VR room. The Gila monster was being treated inside of the enclosure.

On March 3rd, 2023, Mario was released from the hospital and has recovered from the bite incident. No further on this case.

On January, 11th, 2023 I was notified by the Zoological Wildlife Foundation of a bite incident that occurred on premise involving a member of the public and a Capuchin Monkey. The facility provided an in house report and picture of the injury for reference. There was a former employee of the facility, that is now a volunteer, that was handling the Capuchin on a leash outside of its enclosure when the bite occurred. I made contact with the owner and licensee, Mario Tabraue and he provided the information for the volunteer so I could contact her. The volunteer's name was Amanda Capo (

). I spoke with Amanda and we set a meeting at the facility on Friday, January 20th, 2023, in order to obtain a statement and go over the bite incident. I also conducted a routine facility inspection under ISR062699.

Capo provided a statement as follows:

"I, volunteer caretaker at ZWF, approached an enrichment site where next to enrichment site, an ending of a tour was taking place. Guest strayed a short distance away from the tour group and asked me if Abella was a Capuchin that they would see and I let her know that she was an older Capuchin and not part of their tour. Guest asked if she could take pictures and I told her yes, as long as she kept a safe distance away from the monkey. Guest being a distance away was trying to get monkeys attention attempting to direct me on where monkey wanted to go and how she wanted to be on base (trunk) of tree instead of leaves on tree. Despite multiple warnings of being told to keep a safe distance away from monkey, guest got bit after putting herself in close enough proximity to monkey. I took guest to office where I immediately administered first aid and filed an incident report. Monkey jumped off tree, went to floor and bit guest on right thigh."

On Friday, January 27th, 2023, I made contact with the guest that got bit by the monkey. Her name is (DL # (

her to coordinate another investigator to take the statement in person, being that she lives in Boca Raton, FL.

On Tuesday, February 7th, 2023 at approximately 1430 hours, Investigation Howell met with and to obtain a sworn written statement from her. Upon meeting with her, **stated** she was unable to provide a written statement and would prefer to have a blank copy emailed to her to fill out.

On Wednesday, February 8th, 2023, I emailed her a blank copy of a sworn written statement that could be filled out on a computer. I pre filled out the information on the case and her personal information. I instructed her to fill out the summary portion of the statement with the facts leading up to and following the bite incident. I advised her to print, sign and scan it back to me once completed.

On Tuesday, February 13th, 2023 at 0800, **present** emailed me back her completed statement. I wrote in the time and date the statement was received back via email.

# Okun provided a statement as follows:

" On January 7th, a group of four of us were visiting the ZWF Miami Facility. We had arranged for a tour and two animal encounters. While finishing up our last encounter for the day, with a baby Capuchin monkey, which was being handled by our guide, another guide came by with Abela, an older Capuchin monkey. This was not part of our tour, We were completely separated from any other group or animals. There was no reason for her to bring the animal towards us. The two guides were openly talking about how Abela did not get along with the baby Capuchin. We took a few pictures of Abela, stopped interacting with either monkey and were getting ready to leave. I was about 6 to 9 ft away from Abela, not interacting with her, and getting ready to leave for the day, when she jumped off the tree stump the handler had put her down on and raced across the ground and bit my inner thigh. I am not sure why she was not secured by the handler. While she has a leash, it apparently was long enough to not protect someone decently far away. The bite was severe.

We immediately asked for medical attention and treatment and were told that they would call someone within the facility to come help. While waiting for this person, Abela's handler, was incredibly unprofessional and not seemingly focused on my bleeding and exceptionally painful leg. She seemed to think that telling me that people got bit all the time by animals would help. She started to show me the bite she got and I tried to get her to focus on my situation. They brought out a medical kit, which contained a few bandages, had an old tube of antiseptic, but had no over the counter pain medicine or even a cold pack. They eventually brought a used cold pack that my husband had to take to the bathroom to wash off because it was so dirty. Someone finally came by, and he was marginally more competent than the handler. He, at least, knew what band aids to use, as the handler was trying to put on on that did not cover the wound. After putting on the band aid, the wound continued to bleed through. We asked if there was a doctor to see or consult with , they said 'no.' We asked what type of

doctor to seek care from, they did not know.

We tried to contact the facility for many days to try to confirm that Abela has the correct vaccination. It took five calls and well over a week. We mentioned that the wound was still bleeding, again asked about the correct medical care, and also asked to speak with the veterinarian. We were told to go to an emergency room and denied access to the veterinarian. My husband has called numerous times to discuss with the manager any compensation, discipline of the employee and procedures to put in place. These calls have not been returned.

My wound bled for over a week. The skin has not fully healed, as one can still see the bite mark (it has been over a month since being bitten). It is still sore to the touch and there is clearly some tissue damage as you can feel a bump around the bite area. In summary, the animal should not have been brought near us, especially since all parties knew that the baby elicited anger from the older Capuchin. The handler should have been paying more and real attention. The medical response was totally unprofessional as they were completely unprepared for any incident. The communication bordered on non existent (though they did send a vet's scribbled notes).

It is my belief that the facility should be closed down until they exhibit both the procedures and know how to handle all potential problems of the dangerous animals under their care."

After receiving her statement, I inquired with **second** via email if she could provide any of the photos taken of the Capuchin monkey that day. She provided 1 picture of the Capuchin monkey and a picture of her wound.

Upon investigation, I determined the handler, Capo, did not have the Capuchin Monkey under Rigid supervision and control. I found there was no intent on the injury sustained, as the Capuchin was attached to a leash and harness being held by Capo during the incident. did not seek or pursue any further treatment at any medical facility or hospital. Based on the statements, the wound was treated on scene with basic first aid supplies. I have copied the pertinent rules below which specifies rules for unconfined captive wildlife and bites. As of result of the bite incident, I issued Capo a written warning for not maintaining unconfined captive wildlife under rigid supervision and control and for any condition which results in injury to any person which is a violation of FAC 68A-6.009 listed below. No further on this case.

# 68A-6.018 Injuries, Bites, and Escapes.

(<u>1) Any condition which results</u> in wildlife escaping from its enclosure, cage, leash, or other constraint, o<u>r which results in injury to any person, shall be considered a violation of subsection 68A-6.009(1)</u>

# 68A-6.009 General Regulations Governing Possession of Captive Wildlife.

(1) No person shall maintain captive wildlife in any unsafe or unsanitary condition, or in a manner which results in threats to the public safety, or the maltreatment or neglect of such wildlife.

# 68A-6.016 Public Contact with Captive Wildlife.

<u>Unconfined captive wildlife shall be maintained under rigid supervision and control, so as to prevent</u> <u>injuries to members of the public.</u> No captive wildlife shall be tethered outdoors unsupervised. <u>To</u> <u>provide for public safety, all wildlife shall be tethered or controlled in such a manner as to prevent</u> <u>physical contact with the public</u> and a structural safety barrier, as provided in paragraph 68A-6.009(2)(b), F.A.C., must be present to prevent physical contact with unconfined Class I or Class II wildlife except in instances where public contact is allowed in subsection (1), below. (1) Public contact and exhibition.

(a) General: All Class I, II or III wildlife that will be used for contact with the public shall have been evaluated by the exhibitor to insure compatibility with the uses intended. All wildlife shall be exhibited in a manner that prevents injuries to the public and the wildlife. The exhibitor shall take reasonable sanitary precautions to minimize the possibility of disease or parasite transmission which could adversely affect the health or welfare of citizens or wildlife. When any conditions exists that results in a threat to human safety, or the welfare of the wildlife, the animal(s) shall, at the direction of a Commission officer, be immediately removed from public contact for an interval necessary to correct the unsafe or deficient condition.

(b) Class I wildlife shall only be permitted to come into physical contact with the public in accordance with the following:

1. Full contact: For the purpose of this section, full contact is defined as situations in which an exhibitor or employee handler maintains proximate control and supervision, while temporarily surrendering physical possession or custody of the animal to another. Full contact with Class I wildlife is authorized only as follows:

a. Class I cats (Felidae only) that weigh not more than twenty-five (25) pounds,

b. Chimpanzees, orangutans, and gorillas that are not less than six (6) months of age and weigh not more than twenty-five pounds,

c. Gibbons and siamangs not less than four (4) months of age and not more than two (2) years of age, d. Elephants as approved in Rule 68A-6.007, F.A.C.

2. Incidental contact: For the purpose of this section, incidental contact is defined as situations in which an exhibitor or employee handler maintains control, possession and supervision of the animal while permitting the public to come into contact with it. Incidental contact with Class I wildlife is authorized only as follows:

a. Class I carnivores except cheetahs and cougars that weigh not more than 40 pounds,

b. Chimpanzees, orangutans, and gorillas that are not less than six (6) months of age and weigh not

c. Gibbons and siamangs that are not less than four (4) months of age: no maximum poundage or age limit,

d. Elephants,

e. Incidental contact with other Class I wildlife must be approved in writing by the Commission prior to the use of the wildlife for incidental contact with the public. Factors to be considered when approving such contact are found in paragraph (1)(a).

(c). Public contact or handling intervals for Class I wildlife shall be limited as to frequency, intensity, and duration so that such handling will not adversely affect the health, welfare, or safety of the animals, nor expose the public to injury.

On January 18, 2022 at approximately 1200 hours, Lt. Garzaniti and I conducted a routine ESB Class 1/2, ESC Class 3 and VRC inspection at the Zoological Wildlife Foundation (16225 SW 172nd Ave, Miami, FL). The owners and licensees at this facility are Mario Tabraue (DL # 1999) and Maria Tabraue (DL # 1999). Mario accompanied me for the inspection. Upon inspection, two violations were noted. 1) VRC primary enclosure was not properly labeled; 2) The porcupine enclosure was not covered at the top. Both violations were corrected later on the same day. The proper labeling was added to the VRC enclosure and the porcupines were transferred to a compliant enclosure at the facility. I copied the applicable rules for reference. No further violations were noted.

RULES VIOLATIONS:

Porcupine:

Old World porcupines (e.g., crested, bush tailed, and similar sized animals). a. For one to two animals, a cage 8 feet by 8 feet, 6 feet high. For each additional animal, increase cage size by 25 percent of original floor area.

b. Each cage shall have gnawing items and browse. Each cage shall also have perching areas and climbing apparatus except for crested porcupines.

(c) All cages or enclosures less than 1,000 square feet shall be covered at the top to prevent escape (except paddocks, reptile enclosures and habitats specified below). Class I or Class II wildlife shall not be kept in uncovered enclosures that are less than 1,000 square feet, except as specified in this chapter. All outdoor enclosures for non-native venomous reptile species and reptiles of concern shall be topped with close-meshed wire or an equivalent barrier to provide additional security as specified in Rule 68A-6.0171, F.A.C.

While conducting my routine inspection on January 18th, 2022 at Zoological Wildlife foundation (ZWF), I investigated an injury incident that was reported to me on January 14th, 2022 by Mario Tabraue (Owner/licensee of ZWF). On Friday, January 14th, 2022, Tabraue called me and notified me that there had been an injury incident at his facility. He stated that his employee, Angelica Maria De La Pedraja(DL# **Control of Cage**. While the jaguar grabbed the piece of chicken medicated with antibiotics through the side of cage. While the jaguar grabbed the piece of chicken, one of the jaguars claws came in contact with her right hand ring finger and cause a laceration the length of the finger. She then was driven by another employee to West Kendall Baptist Hospital where her injury was treated and stitched it up. She was discharged the same day with no further treatment at the hospital. I advised Tabraue I would go to the facility the following Tuesday to document the incident.

On Tuesday, January 18th, 2021 at approximately 1200 hrs, Lt Garzaniti and I, arrived at ZWF where we met with Tabraue and the victim. The victim confirmed the series of events above that led to the injury and stated she also has a follow-up visit to a hand specialist that she has to schedule to verify if there is any nerve damage. Upon investigation of the incident, I determined there was no violation which led to the injury of the employee. The enclosure for the black jaguar was also a compliant enclosure. No further investigation on this incident.
